SONATINA FESTIVAL -MARCH 18, 2017

It is time to send in your Sonatina Festival Entries this month. Your entries must be received by February 18th, so if you plan to mail them, send them in a few days earlier. Valentine's Day would be a great day to mail them! The chairman cannot attend the February meeting, so plan accordingly. If you renewed your membership to FMTA late (after July 1, 2016), please remember to add \$20 for the late-entry fee. Members who renewed by July 1, 2016 and first time new members pay the regular entry fee. Late entries will **NOT** be accepted, as stated in the registration directions and in the Standing Rules. Please read the Standing Rules and sign that you have read and agree to abide by them. Remember to include an envelope **addressed to you** *with a stamp on it*, so you will receive all the scheduling information on time. All teachers are expected to work that Saturday. If this is not possible, it is your responsibility to find someone to cover your work assignment, and inform the chairman with contact information. This is a one day festival, with recitals in the late afternoon/evening. A PENNY FOR YOUR THOUGHTS

One of our greatest resources is the wisdom and experience of each other! This month we will talk about how to handle <u>transfer students</u>, either receiving them to our studio or sending them to another studio. Come ready to share what you have learned about having a successful transfer, and let's learn from each other.

Note: At our January meeting, Arlyce Black mentioned a resource that many of you were interested in, so we've included that information for you here: *Book 3 - Key to Stylistic Mastery* by Ingrid Jacobson Clarfield and Dennis Alexander. 5 Style Periods – designed to teach the basic principles to piano students. The pieces were chosen to provide a help transition from method books and early intermediate repertoire to classics at the intermediate level. Students will learn to apply stylistic principles directly to these pieces and can then apply them to other music.
