PERFORMANCE GROUP

The October Performance Class will be held at Rocky Mountain Village Estates, Genesee Building, at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, October 14th (Residence of Phyllis Pieffer). Take I-70 west to Evergreen Parkway (just after the Chief Hosa Road exit). Exit at Evergreen Parkway. At the stoplight at the bottom of the Evergreen Parkway ramp, continue straight ahead on Evergreen Parkway to County Road 65 (the stoplight just after Bergen Parkway at King Soopers). There are 3 stoplights--1) El Rancho at the bottom of the Evergreen Parkway ramp; 2) Bergen Parkway--King Soopers sign; and 3) Colorado 65. By the time you reach the second stoplight (Bergen Parkway) be in the left lane. Turn left onto County Road 65 and immediately left into the entrance for Rocky Mountain Village Estates. It would be best to **park either in the Park n'Ride across CR 65 or in the church parking lot and walk up the hill to the second building, Genesee House**. Enter the building and go into the Mountaineer Room on the left. Phyllis will be there to greet you! **Try to carpool if you can as parking is limited.**

CSMTA has made changes in the Student Theory Assessment (STA) program in which students are stimulated and recognized for their theory competency. The testing offered by the California Merit Program is no longer available. Instead the Keynote Independent Theory Service (KITS), which offers tests in Reading, Vocabulary, Listening, and Skills Performance will now be used.
