The Sonatina Festival is coming up quickly, so now is a good time to be planning and preparing students who will be participating! It will be held March 10th at the Colorado Christian University Music Center. **Registration** is due to Evelyn Billberg by February 10th.

The FMTA Sonatina Festival is a competition that takes place each spring. Students will be placed in a Class according to their grade level. They are challenged to perform two memorized movements of a Sonatina from the approved Sonatina Festival Repertoire list. The winners perform at a special Honors Recital and may receive a trophy.

The Musicians Society of Denver was started in 1918 by a group of musicians who supported the symphony guild and sponsored music performances in private homes. In 1936 it was re-organized to become a scholarship club, joining the National Federation of Music Clubs. For many years the Musicians Society of Denver Senior Club has sponsored the Denver Metro Junior Federation Festival in March for federated teachers in the Denver Metro Area. In addition, the MSD was recently re-committed to reviving monthly club performance events at the new Rockley Family Foundation Recital Hall in Lakewood. These events are diverse in nature and are designed to offer performance opportunities to performers of all ages in the Metro Denver community.

LaTonya's jazz vocals and Andy's fearless versatile music as pianist and composer will thrill the MSD audience. Andy is a Yamaha Artist/Educator.
