Golden Teen Honored as Finalist at International Piano Competition

Kayla Wong has been playing the piano since she was four years old. This spring, the Golden teen saw an opportunity to tie everything she's learned throughout her piano career with her knowledge of the music she performs and bring it to a professional level.

The 16-year-old recently competed against more than 160 high school teens in the prestigious Bradshaw & Buono International Piano Competition, based in New York City and culminating in a winner's recital at Carnegie Hall. The annual Competition is designed as an entrée into the world of piano performance for those seriously interested in pursuing a professional career.

Wong was named a finalist and awarded an honorable mention. She received a personal note from the competition directors, who noted that her playing was of considerable distinction, and who pointed out that Wong shows all the signs of taking on an artistry that is international in stature. "The level of competition was exceptionally high this year and Kayla really distinguished herself with her performance," said Cosmo Buono, Steinway Artist and Director of the Bradshaw & Buono International Piano Competition.

For the competition, Kayla performed the Revolutionary Étude, or Étude Op. 10, No. 12 by Frédéric Chopin and the Bells of Moscow, or Prelude in C Sharp Minor by Sergei Rachmaninoff.

"Knowing the history of these pieces was essential because it brought light to a different perspective, which helped me play with more expression and emotion," says Kayla. "Chopin wrote the Revolutionary Étude to narrate Poland's failed revolution against Russia through music as well as portray the Polish spirit. Rachmaninoff wrote Prelude in C Sharp Minor to illustrate the environment and atmosphere of Russia, capturing the powerful sounds of the bells in Moscow," she adds.

"When you're competing at this level, it's about much more than the notes, dynamics and timing," explains Kayla's piano teacher, Leslie Noyes, NCTM, who encouraged Kayla to enter the competition. "The judges are looking for students who can connect the emotional soul of the piece to the audience through their stage presence and musical performance," she adds.

Unlike prior years, when the competition was held at a location with judges in the same room, or the submitted piece was taped at a local recording studio, this years'

experience was completely different due to COVID-19 restrictions. By recording her audition pieces at home, Kayla had to consider presentation factors like lighting and where to position the camera in a way that would best convey her performance and describe her emotions through music. "Overall, this competition was such an insightful experience with so many important takeaways," she says.

When Kayla's not playing the piano, the Lakewood High School junior enjoys competing on her school's cross-country and golf teams. But there's also a strong creative element to her passions and skills. "I'm interested in music composition, specifically for film, and am also interested in pursuing graphic design and photography in the future," she adds.
