Sonatina Festival-March 11th @ CCU

DEADLINE: February 11 approaches quickly. Teachers must register online now. Registration is required now: <u>ONE MONTH BEFORE THE FESTIVAL OCCURS</u>. Please see the links (below) for: *revised* Standing Rules, Required Piano Repertoire, and important links to <u>register students and pay fees</u>. Fees are paid online via PayPal when teachers enter each student.

The 2023 Festival occurs March 12. As before, FMTA's annual Sonatina Festival is held at Colorado Christian University's School of Music, 9200 W Ellsworth, Lakewood, Colorado. Participating teachers volunteer their help March 12, the day of the festival. Each teacher receives notification of student performance times via email. Winners' recitals are held in the auditorium on March 12 at 4:00pm and 5:00pm. Parents, teachers and friends are encouraged to attend the winners' recitals. Festival check-in, Saturday, March 12, begins at 7:30am in the School of Music lobby. At check-in, participating students are notified of their performance room. Results are posted online during the festival, March 12: teachers/students must watch the FMTA Website during the day, March 12, to learn notification of winners and recital time. Winners receive certificates, trophies, ribbons at the winners' recital. Teachers may obtain their students' participation certificates at the lobby registration area. A Word of Testimony and Encouragement from an adult student who recently performed at our 2023 Winter Festival

My vocal coach. She is everything.

Song and singing has always been this far off dream for me. Natural voice, natural pitch. Gifts I have never appreciated in the way they were intended. Over the years, the dream of singing calls me back. When my son was young, choirs in college, a voice class in college, after retirement. This need to be able to sing without running off the stage in tears, something that happened at a young age. I have never forgiven myself and the terror of standing in front of people is so vulnerable and has remained an unconquerable fear.

The deep-down dream of singing in a rock band. A dream never spoken out loud. Dreams are for other people. I chose a path and never wandered from it. Good girl, good wife, good mom, good worker, stayed in my lane. But the whisper of a dream calls, and I wrap it in other language that seems more palatable.

I had enough of a natural gift that I could cheat and not put in the time required, until after having my thyroid removed, I lost my entire singing voice. The grief over losing something that I took for granted broke my soul. The companion that had walked with me was entirely gone. With the soft encouragement of my vocal coach, we walked shoulder to shoulder finding what was left, and worked to coax my voice back into existence. My moods were many and she continued to walk with me, validating the loss and the gains as they came. The only person who truly understood the depth of the loss and the sadness.

For the first time, when a performing opportunity came up, I knew I needed to try. This time, without the need for accolades but to prove that I have survived thyroid cancer, and its side effects, and to remind myself that it can't take away the things that I hold dear. We found a song, and made it work for my new voice. Most of the fear had been left behind me because for the first time, I was performing for myself and my fight to reclaim a part of me that could have been lost without the perseverance of two women knowing the soul moving importance of a voice.
